If you have some time to explore

- MyHeritage have introduced a new 'Table View' feature which displays search results in a more compact form and hence shows more results on the screen. Guard against RSI by reducing your need to scroll. https://blog.myheritage.com/2022/01/introducing-table-view-for-historical-record-search-results/
- Another recent MyHeritage addition is a 'Timeline' which displays "a visual representation of one individual from your family tree, that you select, and his or her direct ancestors." https://blog.myheritage.com/2022/03/introducing-the-family-tree-timeline/
- One of the bugbears about finding WWII records for UK forces is that they are still held by the Ministry of Defence (MoD). To get them you need to fill in a paper form and send a £30 cheque to them. Then they find the records, scan them and post them to you (average time from to receive them has been 9months). This sounds very old school, I know who still uses cheques as the only way to pay (the UK government) and why could you not request them online (no good answer). However, the records are now progressively being transferred to The National Archives and a process is underway to digitise them.
