- Ancestry DNA kits have been discounted to \$89 until 11:59pm on this Wed 08 June. They also have
 a new feature called AncestryDNA Traits which examine sensory and appearance traits and
 compares yours from your DNA test to those of your DNA matches. You can see a review here

 Be aware that the prices shown there are in USD\$. This feature is available
 as a package with a new DNA kit (also on sale) or as an extension to your previous DNA test.
- MyHeritage have upgraded their Census Helper tool. Originally only compatible with the 1950
 US Census, it has now been extended to also work with census records from other countries.
 This tool looks at the records in your MyHeritage family tree file and makes a list of those people who were alive at the time of the census of your choice. This gives you a handy list of who to search for in that census.
