- A reminder: **It's time to get on your competition entries in**. Their sponsors have again provided a number of useful prizes. We know this is definitely worth entering because members of our own group have won prizes from this competition in previous years.
- Don't you just love grumpy old men? FamilySearch have amended many of their christening/baptism records to show parent's sex. For example, Father: David, Father's Sex: Male, Mother: Jane, Mother's Sex: Female. This has prompted much discussion on the GOONS Forum, including someone who wrote that he was displeased to be asked on a DNA questionnaire "what sex was assigned to you at birth?". His reply was "I brought my sex with me when I slid down the birth canal. It was not assigned by some stranger". The organisation subsequently changed the question to "what is your genetic sex?".
