As part of "Remembering the Queen", FindMyPast is making its British and Irish newspaper archive available free of charge until Tuesday 20 Sep at 7pm Brisbane time. Just go to Search at the top of the page https://www.findmypast.com/page/free-access?sourceID=13. You can search by name and keywords, and to make it easier, you can filter by date, place, county, newspaper and article type. That narrows things down a bit!
- The latest Lost Cousins newsletter has an item that may be useful for those of you who are researching Irish ancestors: "Church of Ireland parish registers On Claire Santry's website I found a link to this invaluable PDF document which lists the location of surviving Church of Ireland parish registers." I hope that someone will find something useful in the 100 colour-coded pages of this fabulous document!
