
Next Meeting

- As a follow-up to something we covered only recently, everything you need to know about GEDCOM files: what they are, how to share them and how to download them is available from FamilyTreeMagazine, just click here https://familytreemagazine.com/resources/gedcom-basics.
- Timelines are very useful tools for mapping out an ancestor's life. You can see a chronological schedule of the personal events in their life, you can provide some context to their lifetime by adding historical events, and by mapping the timelines of several individuals (eg, a family group) you can see the overlaps. The last point can be very useful in highlighting any inconsistencies (eg, child born to a mother of considerable age, remarriage date for a man shows the subsequent child must have been born to the second wife, etc).
