
## FindMyPast Skill-builder Solutions



Philemon Stott was baptised in the parish church of **St Stephen and All Martyrs in Oldham**. Note that FMP puts the town first to alphabetically group this church with others in the same location rather than those with the same saint's name. So copy the name directly from the screen as written.

When you paste the church name into the Place search box, the program substitutes a "token" placed underneath. This is because your search is not actually based on the words in the name but an internal code that is invisible to users but makes the program more efficient. This also means that you could type in the name of a second parish that would also be tokenised to allow you to search for either one OR the other at the same time.

**Ogden** Samuel Wild was two given names but that is not always the case. For this task, you need only his first name.

When you replace the last name and add Abraham as a given name in the search panel, remember to remove items that are no longer relevant, such as Father's first name. If you leave John in that box, you will get no result because Abraham Ogden's father was Samuel.

One again, you should copy the parish name (**Blackley, St Peter**) from here and then paste it into an otherwise blank search page.for the final task.

Note that the program appears to have pre-filled some other search boxes (for example Winston Churchill 1908) but anything that begins "e.g." is just a prompt to you and is actually invisible to the search engine. Confusing I know, but you will get used to it.

The search produces more than 10,000 results but use the sort switch (small triangle) on the Year column to see that **Mary Hacking** is the first entry with a known date, 1821.

But view the image rather than just the transcription (using the last icon in the row).

You see that Mary was baptised on 17 December 1852; more than 31 years after she was born.
